# **CSH EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION**

The Cold Spring Harbor Educational Foundation voted to approve two grants at our November board meeting. Below is a brief summary of both.

Global Play Day - Goosehill Primary School; Ms. Cosme Global Play Day celebrates the power of
play in education. This special day (February 5th) is dedicated to unstructured, screen-free play,
allowing children to explore their creativity and social skills freely.

The grant will provide funds to purchase supplies that will be used to set up activities in the classrooms for Global Play Day. In addition, the Youth Ambassadors along with the CSH High School Social Action Club will interact with the students as mentors in various ways throughout the day. The day will start with a schoolwide assembly and then students will visit different classrooms to participate in the activity of their choice.

This day of play is a crucial aspect of a child's social, emotional, and cognitive development. The movement has gained support from educators, parents, and organizations globally, and it continues to grow as more schools recognize the importance of balancing academic rigor with the benefits of play in a child's overall development. Through play, students develop their curiosity, problem-solving skills, intentionality, flexibility, and verbal and non-verbal skills. Socio-emotionally they are developing their emotional intelligence-learning confidence, cooperation, negotiation, sharing, empathy and how to communicate appropriately. This initiative honors the importance of fun and play within the school day; it will support students through play centers during center time, recess, and free play in future years.

<u>Drone Grant - Jr. Sr. High School; Youth Ambassadors/Mrs. McLees</u> This grant was initiated by our Youth Ambassadors back in 2023. The students on the Grants Committee worked diligently alongside Mrs. McLees for many months to get the grant finalized to be presented to our board.

The grant will provide 8 additional drones to be used within the Summer Research Program, Intro to Computer Science II, and eventually in the STEM Technology classes in the Jr. High School. Teaching with drones is a unique way to foster interest in Computer Science and working with autonomous vehicles and systems. Students will be able to take the knowledge they have learned in Computer Science I to program a drone to complete an obstacle course that they pre-program and then run. Currently, there are 5 "teaching" drones, which is not enough to use within a classroom setting. The additional 8 drones will make learning this skill in the classroom feasible. Drones help to foster interest in Computer Science/coding because they are tangible and make learning fun. By using the drones at the Jr. High, teachers can use this as a way to capture interest in coding at an early age.
